Boris: Sounds good. When are we leaving?

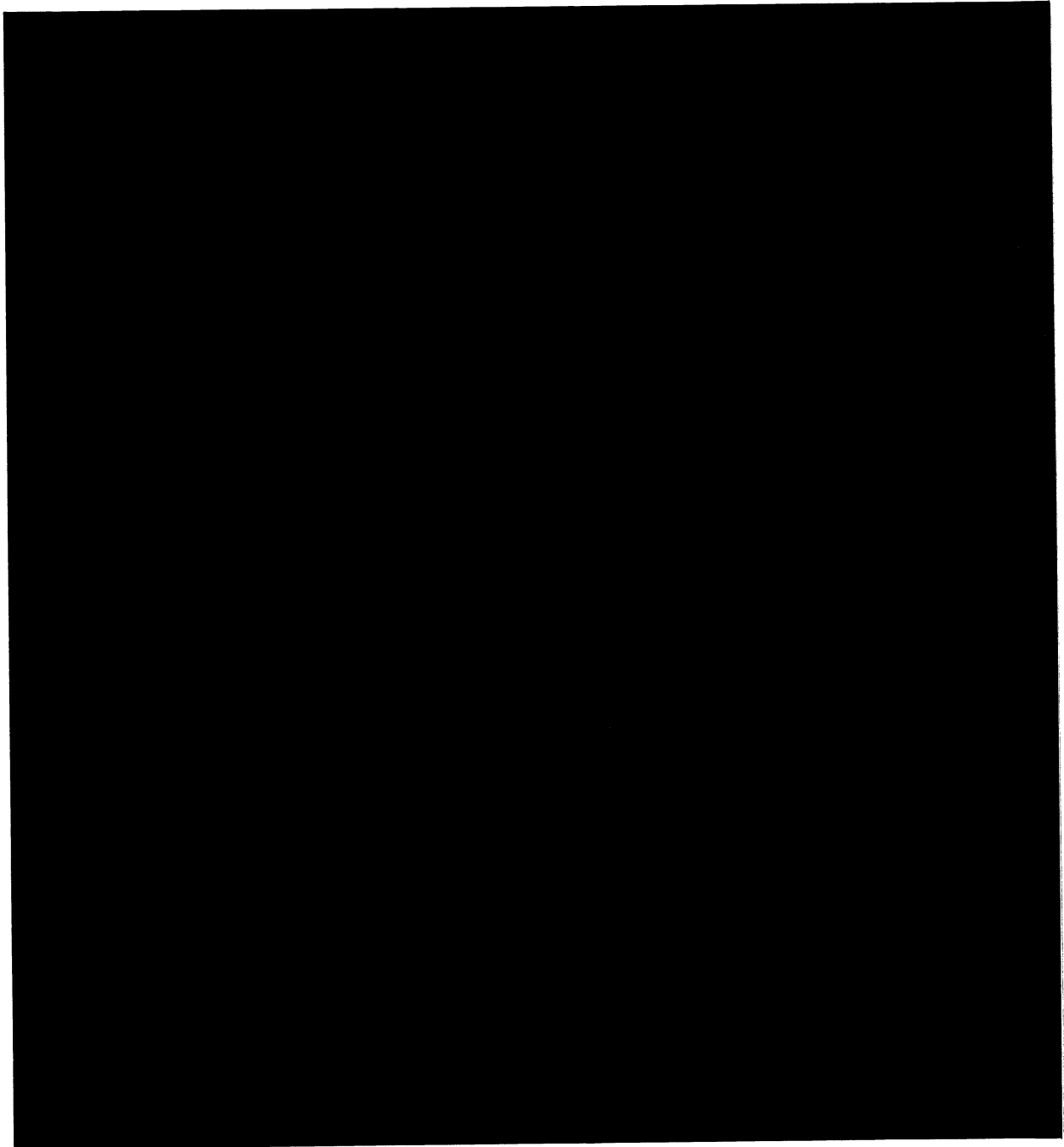

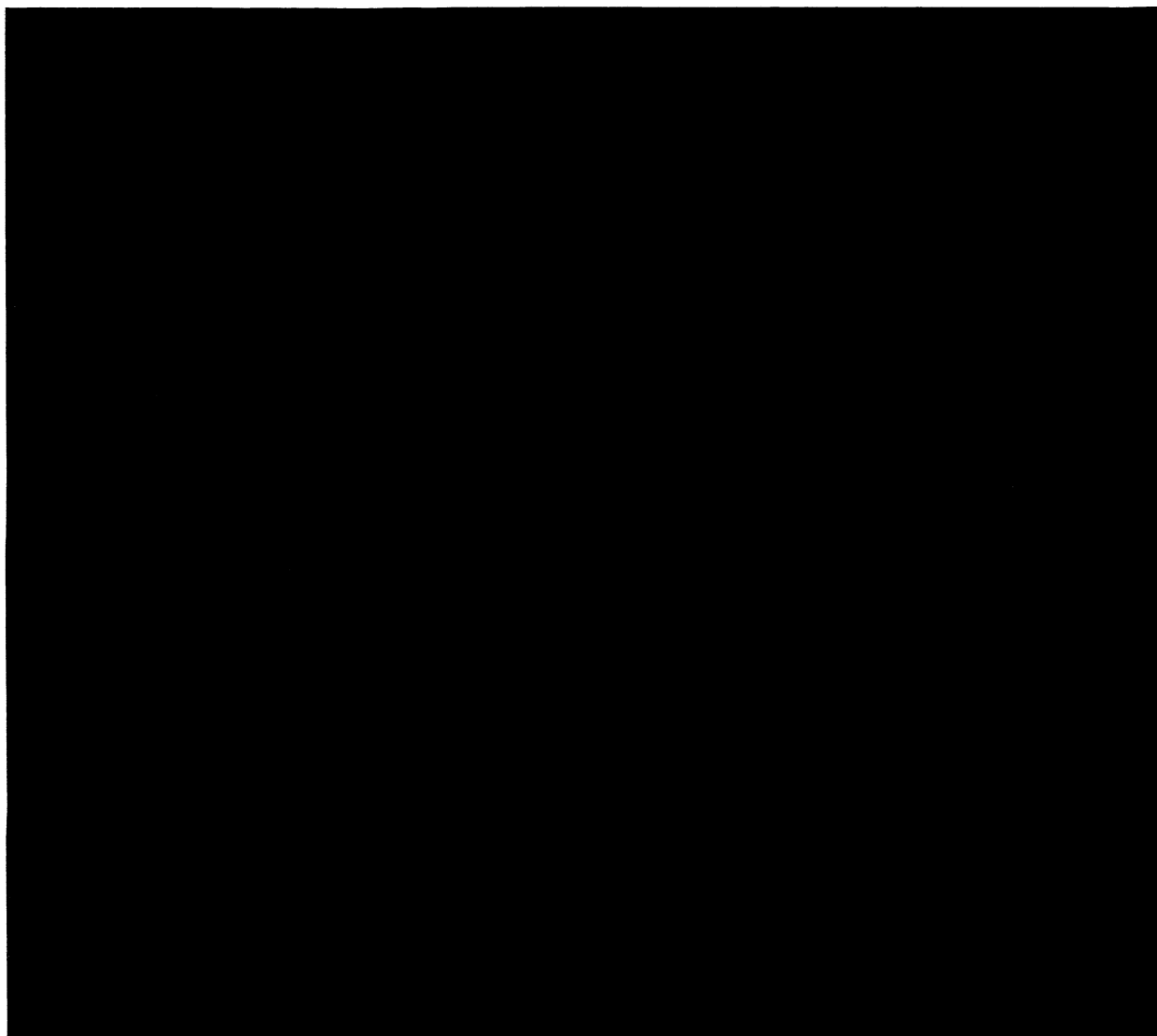

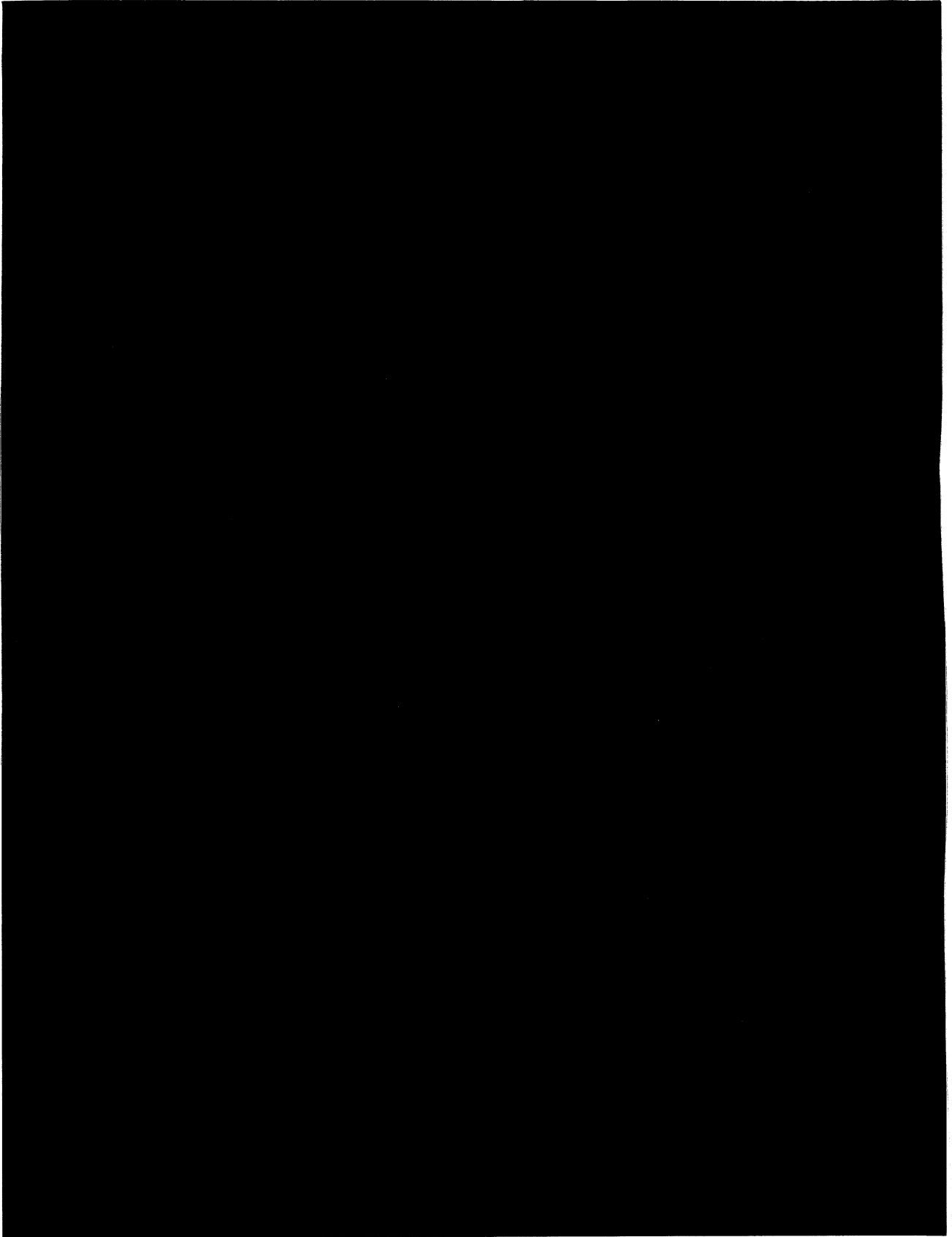
